\_ Increase the economic competitiveness through the role of Jordanian embassies and consulates abroad.

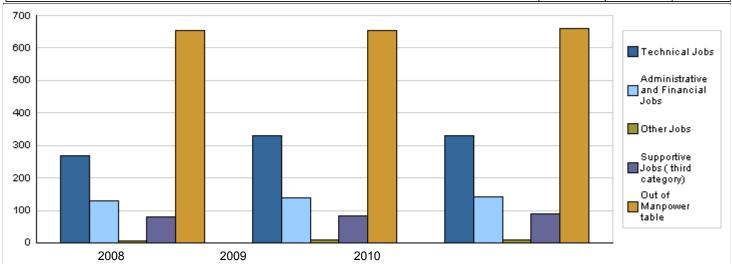

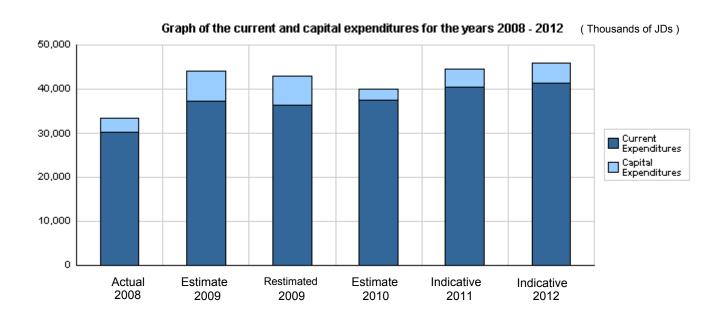

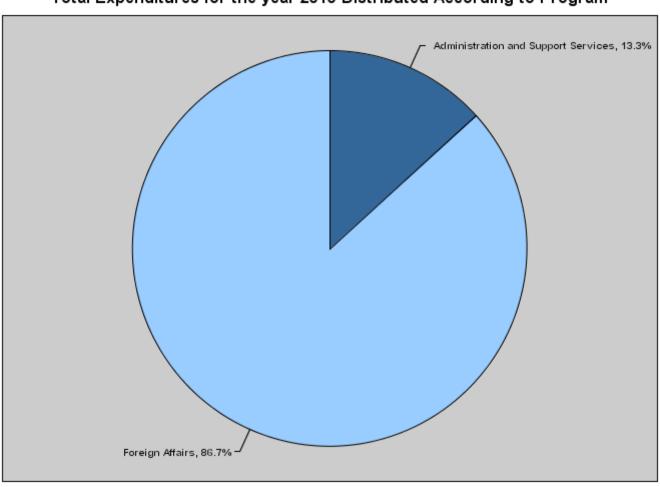
