- Legal Framework: Pursuant to the Food and Drug Administration Law No. (41) of 2008, the Drug and Pharmacy Law No. (12) of 2013 and the Food Law No. (30) of 2015, published in the Official Gazette volume 5345 dated 16/6/2015, the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law No. 23 of 2016 and the Economic Activities Control and Inspection Law the Pharmaceutical Studies Law No. (2) of 2011 and the decisions of the Cabinet and the decisions of the Board of Directors.

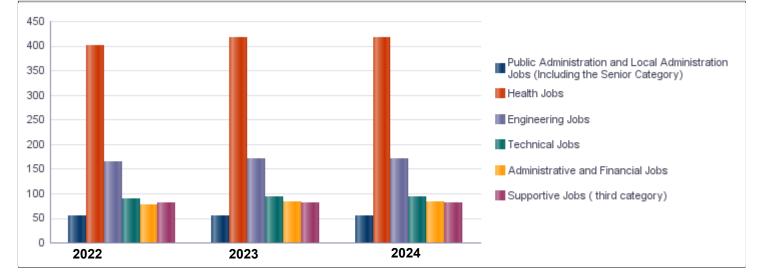

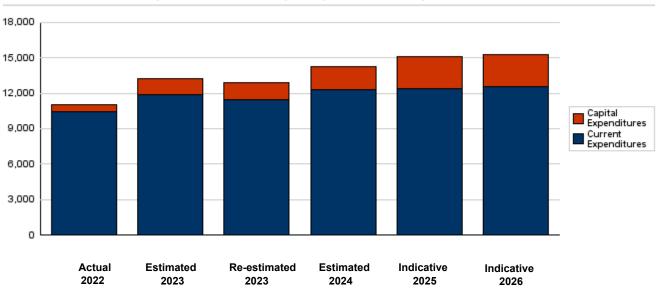
Most notable differences between estimated appropriations for 2024 and re-estimated for 2023
