#### Chapter: 1601 Ministry of Industry, Trade and Supply

Creation: The Ministry of Industry and Trade was established in 1952 under the name of Ministry of Economy

and Trade. Under Ministry of National Economy Regulation and Administration Bylaw No. (12) for the year 1971, it became to be known as the Ministry of National Economy. In line with the international economic developments, Jordan's direction towards economic and trade openness and enhancement of the free economy mechanisms and market forces, Industry and Trade Law No. (18) for the year 1998 was issued; under which the Ministry of Supply was cancelled and its directorates were merged with the directorates of the Ministry of Industry and Trade as the legal successor of the Ministry of Supply then the supply pillar was returned as the main pillar to become the Ministry of Industry, Trade and Supply in 2013 due to the instability of prices of basic

materials that ensure food security for the Jordanian citizen.

Vision: Entrepreneurship and competitiveness in the development of a sustainable national economy.

Mission: Developing economic policies and programmes and enhancing the business environment to be

more competitive and contributing by strengthening strategic inventory and strengthening

partnership with all stakeholders.

Legal Framework: Industry and Trade Law No. (18) for the year 1998, and amendments thereto.

Priorities and targeted results within the determined ceilings for the years 2025 - 2027:

#### First Priority:

- Promoting food security.

#### Key procedures to achieve the first priority:

- The expansion of the Ghabawi containers has been completed with an increase of (100) thousand tons and achieving (100%).
- A bid has been made for the implementation of Qatraneh grains containers with a capacity of (500) thousand tons of Qatraneh grains, and 50% of the project has been implemented.

#### **First Priority Outcomes:**

- Raising the storage capacity of grains (wheat and barley) from (1.6) million tons to become (2.200) million tons.

#### First priority-related program:

- Trade and Strategic Inventory Program.
- Administration and Support Services Program

#### **Second Priority:**

- Implementing the industrial policy document including industry development and support fund.

#### Key procedures to achieve the second priority:

- The Industrial Policy Document for the years (2023-2028) was approved by Council of Ministers Decision No.15395 and the formation of a national team and technical task forces.
- Adopting and initiating the implementation of the industrial policy plan, which includes (programs and projects to be implemented with relevant stakeholders).
- Signing special agreements with companies benefiting from the second and final round of the incentive program based on output before the end of this year.
- Signing a special agreement with companies benefiting from the industrial modernization programme (JEDCO) before the end of this year.
- Signing agreements with companies benefiting from the export credit guarantee program (Jordanian Loan Guarantee Company) before the end of this year.

#### **Second Priority Outcomes:**

- Supporting the industrial sector technically to develop the local product.
- Increasing the volume of total industrial investment.
- Realizing growth in the industrial sector through assisting companies in the industrial sector to raise their exports.
- Increasing industry competitiveness in domestic and international markets.
- Reducing the cost of production and other costs to national industry.
- Providing job opportunities for a large number of Jordanians within the standards for benefiting from subsidy programs of the industrial sector.

#### Second priority-related program:

- Organization and Promotion Program for Industrial and Commercial Development.
- Industrial and Commercial Sector Competitiveness Program.

#### **Third Priority:**

- Implementation of the national export strategy.

#### Key procedures to achieve the third priority:

- Approval of the implementation plan of the National Export Strategy for 2024, which will be implemented by the technical task forces of the National Executive Committee of the Strategy.
- Launching of the Export Acceleration Program and completion of the first phase of this program in cooperation with the Export House Company (The phase of assisting SMEs operating in the industrial sector in all governorates of the Kingdom in obtaining the necessary information on target markets and enabling them to enter markets by increasing their export readiness and competitiveness) by providing financial support to these enterprises for the preparation of targeted international and regional market studies of export markets.
- Launching the program to stimulate exports in cooperation with the Jordan Enterprise Development Corporation with a view to enhancing the competitiveness of exports in the sector of advisory services for foreign markets, which is implemented in three Phase I: Phase I: Financial Support for the Preparation of Market Studies of Export Markets Targeted by Service Establishments, Phase II: Phase of support for the implementation of the export plan for consultancy enterprises in target markets, and phase III: The phase of engaging consulting companies in trade fairs and bilateral meetings for the industrial sector.

#### **Third Priority Outcomes:**

- Increasing competitiveness of Jordanian products of goods and services, maximizing exports, enhancing Jordanian product position in global markets and opening new markets
- Developing exports promotion services, fairs and studies for opening export markets of companies.

#### Third priority-related program:

- Organization and Promotion Program for Industrial and Commercial Development.
- Industrial and Commercial Sector Competitiveness Program.

#### **Fourth Priority:**

- Implementing the national strategy for e-commerce.

#### Key procedures to achieve the fourth priority:

- The National E-Commerce Strategy was launched.
- A bid has been made for the establishment of an e-commerce platform.

#### **Fourth Priority Outcomes:**

- Enabling work environment for e-commerce in Jordan
- Supporting small and medium companies and companies owned by women in the transition to online selling

#### fourth priority-related program:

- Organization and Promotion Program for Industrial and Commercial Development.
- Industrial and Commercial Sector Competitiveness Program.

#### **Five Priority:**

 Enhancing the performance of the monitoring role to control prices and addressing concentration and monopoly policies in different economic sectors.

#### Key procedures to achieve the fifth priority:

- The Competition Law Amendment Law was passed with the aim of protecting and promoting free competition in the market by reviewing provisions to prohibit practices that impede fair competition, thereby contributing to the advancement of the national economy.
- The first phase of the price observatory was launched and work is under way on the second phase.

#### **Five Priority Outcomes:**

- Developing the market control system and enhancing transparency in whistle-blowing.
- Establishment of a price observatory to monitor all variables in commodity prices.
- Promoting competition policies through awareness of competition provisions.

#### Fifth priority-related program:

- Market Monitoring and Follow-up Program.

#### Sixth Priority:

- Facilitating the business environment.

#### Key procedures to achieve the sixth priority:

- Implementing the National Strategy for the Development of Business Inspection to develop the inspection system, address challenges, identify roles and procedures for achieving objectives through smart inspection practices, establish intelligent inspection methodology in regulatory bodies and promote healthy working environments among economic activities.
- Developing and implementing industrial property protection policies including trademarks and patents.

#### **Sixth Priority Outcomes:**

- Development of the system of control and inspection of economic activities.
- Development of industrial property protection policies.

#### Sixth priority-related program:

- Administration and Support Services Program.

#### Priority of gender, youth and persons with disabilities:

- Empowerment of women.

#### Key procedures to achieve the priority of gender, youth and persons with disabilities:

- A national team has been formed to enable women-owned enterprises to access different economic opportunities.
- Holding workshops for companies owned by women or employing women on "the possibility of developing exports and expanding into additional markets by upgrading their market analysis capabilities and creating appropriate export opportunities".
- Conducting several specialized training courses to ensure that staff members possess the concepts associated with women's economic empowerment.

#### The following outcomes are expected to be achieved for the priority of gender, youth & persons with disabilities

- Establishment of a Women's Empowerment Unit within the Ministry to empower women economically through coordination with all relevant bodies to consolidate efforts to promote women's participation in the Jordanian economy.

#### Priority-related program of gender, youth and persons with disabilities :

- Industrial and Commercial Sector Competitiveness Program.

#### Priority of climate change:

- Applying the green economy system concept in the industrial companies.

#### Key procedures to achieve climate change-related priority:

- Identification of operational procedures and submission of plans for the application of cleaner and efficient production alternatives in the use of resources for 10 plants (5 small and 5 medium).
- Providing technical advice for the implementation of feasible short-term improvement proposals for 10 factories (5 small and 5 medium).

#### The following outcomes are expected to be achieved for the priority of climate change:

- Promoting shifting to green economy in the Jordanian industries and companies to increase their competitiveness and productivity,reduce their operational expenditure and finding more job opportunities.

#### Program of climate change-related priority:

- Organization and Promotion Program for Industrial and Commercial Development.

#### Tasks of the Ministry / Department :

- Business Environment pillar: contributing to the development of investment legislation, simplifying procedures, automating services, promoting creativity and innovation.
- Supply and internal trade pillar: securing a strategic stock of wheat and barley, controlling markets and consumer protection, regulating e-commerce legislatively and operationally, and strengthening partnership with the commercial sector.
- Industry pillar: developing industrial sectors and enhancing their competitiveness internally and externally, strengthening partnerships with the industrial productive sector, focusing on high-value industries, enhancing the sustainability of industrial sectors and providing support to this end.
- Foreign trade pillar: supporting exports of industrial and service sectors, concluding free trade agreements, opening new non-traditional markets

#### Ministry/Department Contribution to the Achievement of the National Objectives:

- Creating an attractive investment environment capable of attracting foreign capitals and encouraging local investments.
- Realizing sustainable growth rates to ensure good level of living for all citizens.
- Reducing poverty and unemployment levels and build effective social protection system.




#### Most notable differences between estimated appropriations for 2025 and re-estimated for 2024

#### **Current expenditure:**

- Current expenditure increased by (737) thousand JDs, which came as a result of:
- Compensations of employees group increased by (531) thousand JDs to cover the natural annual increase, cover the cost of vacancies, new jobs, other appointments and redeployments and reduce the cost of terminating staff members' services.
- Operational expenditure increased by (81) thousand JDs, most of which were concentrated in cleaning and supplies items, and costs of utilizing the attachments to diplomatic missions' headquarters.
- Increasing the subsidies of non-financial public institutions in the amount of (100) thousand JDs on ships surplus item.
- Other expenditures increased by (25) thousand JDs concentrated on contributions item.

#### Capital expenditure:

- Capital expenditures increased by (7.369) thousand JDs, as a result of the following:-
- Economic modernization vision projects increased by (7.652) million JDs, as a result of the increase in projects and decrease in other projects, notably the increase in the Industrial Support Fund project by (9.735) million JDs and the reduction in the project to increase the storage capacity of grain absorbers (100) thousand tons in Gbawi by (897) thousand JDs and the reduction in the project to prepare and implement the national export strategy by (1.046) million JDs.
- The Ministry's other projects decreased by (317) million JDs, most notably the decrease in the project of exhibitions and export promotion by (235) million JDs.
- Increase in governorate (decentralization) projects by (34) thousand JDs.

#### Program's main outputs and results during the years (2025 -2027):

- Control over the abundance and prices of essential items determined in accordance with a decision of the Prime Minister's Office and verify that prices of goods and materials are declared and sold in accordance with these prices.
- Availability of inventory at wholesalers and control of any concealment or refusal to sell essential items and control of downloads, liquidation and promotional awards.
- Addressing complaints from consumers through mechanisms and procedures that ensure that their rights are upheld without prejudice to providers' interests.
- Raising awareness among consumers' and suppliers' sectors of consumer protection legislation.

#### The Program's challenges:

- The shortage of cadres in the departments of the Directorate of Market Control in addition to the shortage of vehicles and drivers in the Movement Section.
- Low level of awareness of consumers' and providers' rights and duties.
- Low level of awareness of electronic commerce between suppliers' and consumers' sectors.

#### Actions to address challenges and improve services provided:

- Recruitment of staff, drivers and purchase of new vehicles to increase the number of control tours and price monitoring.
- Developing a comprehensive awareness-raising plan to disseminate consumer awareness among members of society.
- Raising awareness of e-commerce operations to preserve consumers' rights.
- Legislation governing electronic sales to protect consumers.

#### Gender:

The programme works to increase training programmes for women in the Ministry as well as women's participation in decision-making and empowerment for supervisory and leadership positions

#### Staff working in the program:

The program is implemented through a functional staff in 2024 estimated with (66) staff, including (47) males and (19) females.
