Mission: To ensure the safety and quality of food and effectiveness of relevant medicine and materials

through policies and legislations built on international standards characterized by transparency

and participatory and increasing citizen awareness.

No. (12) of 2013 and the Food Law No. (30) of 2015, published in the Official Gazette volume 5345 dated 16/6/2015, the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law No. 23 of 2016 and the Economic Activities Control and Inspection Law the Pharmaceutical Studies Law No. (2) of 2011

and the decisions of the Cabinet and the decisions of the Board of Directors.

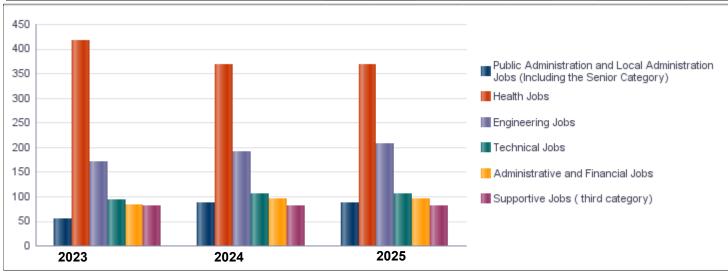

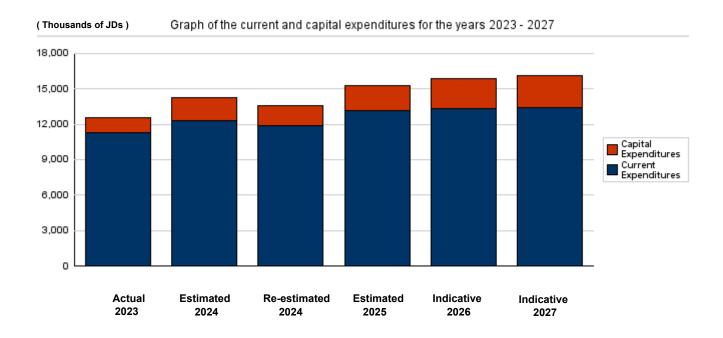
